## Grindlinger Strikes Paydirt from a report by Elizabeth Macron Esq.

The Grindlinger for U.S. Senate Campaign fund raiser —Freedom Day—at the Indian Rock Reservation in Jackson, N.J. was attended by NJLP members and non-members supporting the Future Freedom Foundation. A successful event raised \$2,300 for the Grindlinger Campaign.

Jacob "Bumper" Hornberger spoke to freedom lovers about his experiences as a nemployee with HUD and the ACLU. He realized that the agencies empowered for the poor have no intention of helping the poor—only controlling them. Mr. Hornberger also summarized the Roosevelt "revolution" that led this government from the free market to a controlled system. He said we must have a new revolution to restore our economic and personal freedoms.

Don Ernsberger, U.S. Senate Candidate from Penn., held a Pyramid auction to raise funds. The crowd bid for the pleasure of destroying (symbolically) freedom-sucking governmental agencies. One pyramid was devoted to economic agencies and the other to personal behavior agencies. A successful bid allowed the participant to rip off the board and tear up the agency's name card.

Let's re-intensify letter writing.

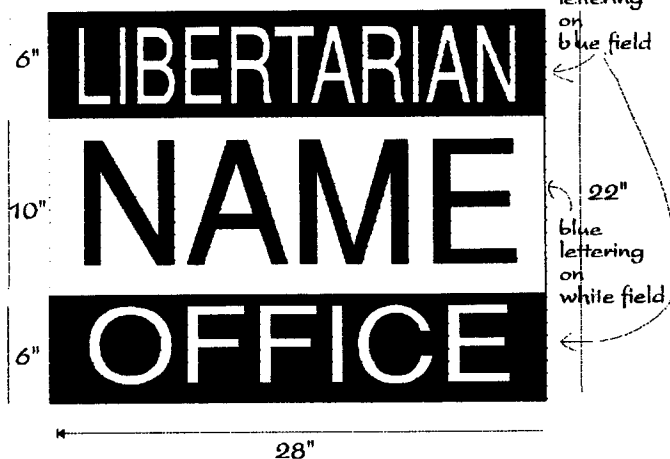
Earlier this year we had several members' letters published in various newspapers, but it has fallen off. Pick any issue and provide the Libertarian solution to it.

# Story Behind AJR-41 and Chuck Haytaian

Republican U.S. Senate hopeful Chuck Haytaian has introduced an Assembly resolution telling the federal government to respect state rights. Haytaian and seven other members of New Jersey's lower house have signed onto Assembly Joint Resolution No. 41, which commands the federal government to "cease and desist" passing mandates that are outside the scope of federal authority granted by the Constitution. Similar measures have been introduced in other states, including Washington, Ohio and Colorado. The full text of the resolution is reprinted herein. *(Official copies may be ordered by calling 800/792-8630 from within New Jersey and 609/292-4840 from outside the state.*

The resolution has been assigned to the Assembly State Government Committee, which is chaired by Assemblyman David

Russo (R-Bergen).

Other committee members are John Rooney (R-Bergen), Carol Murphy (R-Morris), Leonard Lance (R-Hunterdon), Joan Quigley (D-Hudson) and Joseph Yuhas (D-Mercer).

According to a staffer at Russo's office, the Assembly State Government Committee is only scheduled to meet once before the November election—on September 29th. She also said that the September 29th agenda, although not yet complete, doesn't list ACR-41 for action.

According to a staffer at Haytaian's office (908/850-8800), Haytaian isn't really a sponsor of the resolution! According to the staffer, Haytaian is just a cosponsor, and parties are given Assemblyman John Kelly's phone number (201/667-6123). According to the Office of Legislative Services, however, Haytaian and Kelly jointly sponsored the bill and were joined by six cosponsors.

State of New Jersey Assembly Joint Resolution No. 41 By Assemblymen KELLY, HAYTAIAN, Kavanaugh, Solomon DeGaetano, Bateman, Rocco and Mikulak (*Prime Sponsors in CAPS*)

A JOINT RESOLUTION declaring the sovereignty of this State under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted by that Constitution to the federal government.

WHEREAS, The Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads as follows: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people", and

WHEREAS, The Tenth Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as being that specifically granted by the United States Constitution and no more; and

WHEREAS, The scope and power defined by the Tenth Amendment means that the federal government was created by the States specifically to be an agent of the States; and

WHEREAS, Today, the States are demonstrably treated as agents of the federal government; and

WHEREAS, Many federal mandates are directly in violation of the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court has ruled in *New York vs. United States*, 112 S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the legislative and regulatory process of the states; and

WHEREAS, A number of proposals from previous federal administrations, and some now pending from the present Administration and from Congress, may further violate the United States Constitution; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of New Jersey:

1. The State of New Jersey hereby claims sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government by the United States Constitution.

2. This resolution constitutes notice and demand upon the federal government, as agent of this State and the several other states, to cease and desist, effective immediately, the imposition upon the states of mandates that are beyond the scope of the federal government's constitutionally delegated powers.

3. Duly authenticated copies of this resolution shall be sent to the President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate, the presiding officers in each House of the legislatures of the other states of the United States, and every member of the United States Congress elected from this State.

4. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.

illegal guns keeps going up and the availability of guns to criminals increases. It is reported among the ranks that you can rent a gun in Newark for a crime and then return it.

2. Job training since 1969 and subsequent bills and expenditures because the original one failed because of a shortage of funds and poor administration.

3. 1969 -The cop on the beat; foot patrol, scooter patrol, three wheel scooter patrol, bicycle patrol, horse patrol, citizen auxiliary patrol, just plain overtime patrol, all funded by state and/or federal funds, always leaving the municipality in the hole when the funds stop but, subsequent bills and expenditures because the original one failed because of a shortage of funds and poor administration.

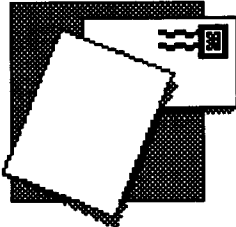

*In the last issue, the Editor commented on the pro-choice ad (on p. 5 of this issue) and asked one of the sponsors to reply.)*

Ideally, the two people making a pregnancy would be in agreement. If such is not the case, however, and they are not married, if the woman wants the pregnancy and not the man, the only legal way he can be made responsible for the impending birth is through cumbersome and expensive DNA testing. Generally, even in a marriage, paternity is assumed.

On the other hand if the man wants a baby and the woman does not, he should be

prepared to either break off the relationship and find a woman who has the same vision he has or just stay with his beloved in quiet frustration... a woman forced to go through an unwanted pregnancy is being victimized. (Ed. *Is a man forced to accept an unwanted paternity being victimized?*)
